An Update From Your Family Advisory Council



The first meeting of the 2022-2023 Eau Claire Area School District Family Advisory Council (FAC) was held on October 4th. Superintendent Mike Johnson and Executive Director of Business Services Abby Johnson gave a detailed informational presentation about the upcoming Capital Referendum then answered questions, received feedback, and addressed the concerns of FAC members in attendance.

The second FAC meeting was held on November 1st. The meeting began with the selection of new FAC officers: Lyndsay Simmons (Roosevelt) and Jenna Murphy (Memorial) are this year's Co-chairs; Rob Geske (Northstar and North) is the Secretary. Superintendent Mike Johnson and Executive Director of Business Services Abby Johnson provided a Referendum status report on the continuing informational efforts of the District. Superintendent Johnson then provided an overview of the first quarter of the school year, future goals for the remainder of the school year, and the status of German programming.

As a member of this committee, you would receive input from other parents at DeLong during our PTO meetings and a notice in our monthly newsletter.


