Meeting called to order at 7:01pm.

### 1. Welcome and News from Schools – Jenna Murphy

- Spaghetti feed at Memorial
- Roosevelt LMS Aaron Athas won a fellowship award from Herb Kohl Foundation
- Virtual School expansion approved by school board, will add 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade plus seats 6-12
- Montessori principal interviews tomorrow
- Lakeshore had a read-and-feed fundraiser where students raised \$300 which was matched by the Lakeshore PTO and donated to Solar on Eau Claire Schools project

#### 2. Ellen and Steve Terwilliger, Solar on Eau Claire Schools Project

- School Board approved project which will place solar panels on each high school and will save ECASD approximately \$20,000/year on utility expenses
- Will provide STEM curriculum opportunities which can be accessed District-wide
- 360 panels are being donated by Cal Coulliard, MHS Grade
  - o If they raise \$250,00 for installation, maintenance, etc., an additional 360 panels will be donated by an anonymous donor
- They've received donations in a variety of amounts from \$10-\$10,0000 mainly through private donors
- Please visit Eau Claire Public Schools Foundation webpage to learn more, watch a YouTube video, donate
- Students are helping spread the word, the fundraising committee can speak to PTO's and is attending several community events to get the word out
- There will be internship opportunities through CVTC with the solar panels
- May 1 is the goal to raise all funds they've raised over 25% and are hoping for bigger grants but need many more donations to achieve the goal by May 1

## 3. Jill Elliot, Family/Community Partnership Coordinator at Prairie Ridge

- Prairie Ridge is leading the District on working with families and staff to incorporation Social Emotional Learning and family friendly environment in the schools
- Jill Elliot has been with ECASD for 15 years and has been in her position since the first year of 4K
- Jill reviewed the history of Early Learning; ECASD has had Head Start since 1970; Head Start focuses on academics, health and wellbeing, and family
- 2005-2006 was the first year of 4K in Eau Claire and to receive full funding we must provide 87.5 hours of family learning opportunities
- The challenge has been combining 4K and Head Start requirements
- Diverse team working with families
- Conscious Discipline several years in now which focuses on teaching missing skills or answering a call for help rather than a behavior problem
- Conscious Discipline is at Prairie Ridge and all 20 Community sites the goal is to spread it into Kindergarten next
- Touch, presence and eye contact can be carried forward at all ages to create love rituals for older children, adults, etc.
- Staff go through training and then eventually become trainers and create model classrooms
- Prairie Ridge also is working to fight hunger and support impoverished families in other ways

## 4. Dr. Hardebeck, Referendum Planning Feedback

- The Board would like feedback from families on how to address southside expansion and what families would like to see as part of a referendum
- A referendum will include updates at Roosevelt and South. Staff have requested more operational types of funding in terms of technology and staffing, compensation and benefits.
- The Board will begin surveying the community for feedback and listening sessions will be scheduled in the future.
- Half-sheets were handed out for feedback

#### 5. Superintendent's Update

- School Board is conducting phone interviews this week and are hoping to identify finalists to bring in at the end of March or early April
- School Board has set a date for possible referendum
