1-1-1 ck Spelling Rule:

When you hear a single /k/ sound at the end of a one syllable word, and it follows right after one short vowel write a “ck” ending.

Teaching the Lesson:

During the lesson, your child will need to distinguish if the word with a /k/ sound follows the ck rule or another pattern. For example, if there is a one syllable word with a short vowel, and right after the vowel you hear another consonant with the “k” sound then you use a “k” blend (examples: -sk, -nk, or -lk) not “ck”. Also, long vowel words do not follow the rule and are written with a “k” followed by silent e.

Dictate the following words for students to write. Explain that some words will follow the ck rule and some won't. Remind your child that the ck rule is used when there is a single “k” sound right after a short vowel. Coach your child to tune into the vowel first. If the vowel is long (says its letter name) and there is a “k” sound right after, then the

word doesn't follow the rule and is a "k silent e" pattern. If the vowel is short (says its special sound) then the child needs to focus on the sounds after the vowel to determine if the sound is a k blend (-lk, -sk, -nk) or a single "k" sound which follows the rule and is written as a "ck" ending.

Dictate as many words as time allows during the fifteen-minute lesson.

ART CHOICE #1: MONSTERS!! Big vs. Small



One way to use space is to make things big and small. (Big can seem close and small can seem far away too!)

1. Draw two monsters on the same piece of paper. One monster should be big and one should be very small. **Remember:** a monster can look like anything. Use your imagination!
2. OR look at the Monster Body Parts page [here](#) to get more ideas.



CHALLENGE: draw and color a background for your monsters to live together.

ART CHOICE #2: NOTAN

You'll need two different colors of paper—any kind, junk mail, wrapping paper, magazines. One piece can be bigger than the other.

1. Draw half of an object on the edge of the smaller piece of paper.
 2. Cut along the line—CUT CAREFULLY. You'll need all the pieces, even if you mess up!
 3. On the big paper, glue the cut out piece along the edge of the original piece (symmetry line) to create a whole object!
 4. Start simple, but try more complicated designs once you've got it.
- HINT:** Your composition is more interesting if you use most of the paper. Like the octopus.
