WELCOME TO THE 2020-21 SCHOOL YEAR!

ECASD GRADING SYSTEM

Memorial High School implements a grading system that includes plus/minus grades (A, A-, B+, B, B-, C+ C-, D+, D, D-, and F). The plus/minus system will give a more accurate reflection of academic performance, as well as provide a uniform grading scale to help with consistency in grading. First and third quarter report cards are distributed to students in their second hour classes. Semester 1 and 2 reports cards, and mid-quarter Potential Failure Notices are mailed home for students earning a D+ or below in any of their current courses. Grade point averages are computed according to a 4.0 point scale.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance and academic performance are closely related. To benefit fully from the instructional program, all students are expected to attend school regularly and to be on time for all classes and study halls. The high school attendance policies are designed to develop students' punctuality, self-discipline, and responsibility.

Attendance Procedures—Parents/Guardians should contact the attendance office (715-852-6300) 7:00 a.m. - 3:30 p.m. on the day the child will be absent from school, either for a portion or the full day of school; OR provide the school with a written

verification of absence. Please prearrange any foreseen absence. Students are required to check out of and into the attendance office when leaving or arriving back to school. After 48 hours from the date of the absence, if no excuse is provided, the absence will be considered unexcused.

Unexcused Absences—Students who are unexcused from classes and/or study halls are considered to be truant from school. Students will meet with a principal and detention(s) may be assigned after school. After school detentions are held on Tuesdays and Thursdays between 3:00pm. to 4:00pm. Students failing to attend the after school detention will be issued a truancy citation and report to Truancy Court, which is held every week at the County Court House. Questions or concerns about attendance or truancy can be directed to Assistant Principals.



SKYWARD

Students and Parents will automatically be given access to Skyward upon registration and activated status. Students will receive a Student Access account and parents will receive a Family Access account. It is recommended that parents do not utilize their student's account, as these accounts are unique to the user.

Family Access for Parents

Family Access is a real-time, secure internet-based website that allows you to view your student's information. Different information is available for different grade levels. Family Access will help you stay informed about your student's progress. Your building and the district will also use Family Access as a communication tool to create a stronger relationship between parents and our school community. Only one account is needed even if you have multiple students in the district. If you had an account last year, you will continue to use that username and password. You do not need to obtain a new account. To obtain your username and password, you can click [here](#) or on the [SKYWARD link](#) at the top of all pages on our website and choose the "Forgot login/password". If your account has an email associated with it, you will receive an email with your login information. If you do not have an email address associated with your account, you will need to contact your school. You can also contact the Enrollment Office for assistance at 715-852-3063.



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Family and Emergency Information

It is essential Memorial High School has up-to-date contact and emergency information in Skyward for students. Skyward Family Access gives parents/guardians the ability to make online changes to information such as phone numbers, emails and emergency contacts at any time during the year. Log into your Family Access Account, Click "Student Info" and then "Request Changes for [Student Name]" on the upper right. If you prefer, or do not have computer access, you can contact the secretary by [email](#) or call 715.852.6301 to update information in Skyward. *If you need your **address** changed, DPI and the ECASD policy requires you to visit the District Enrollment Office or see the MHS secretary. You will need to complete a change of address form and present proof of your new address (i.e. utility bill, mortgage or lease agreement).*

TRANSCRIPTS

The Eau Claire Area School District high school transcript consists of courses taken, the letter grade earned, credits earned, the student's rank, and grade point average. Current students may obtain official transcripts through Parchment free of charge. To order go to the [MHS Webpage](#), scroll down, and click on the "Parchment" button (or use link below). All transcript requests will be processed by Memorial High School within two business days.

DRESS CODE REMINDERS

A student may determine his/her personal dress and grooming within the school guidelines which are intended to ensure the health, safety, and cleanliness of all students and to promote a favorable academic atmosphere. Self-expression is encouraged but must not disrupt the school routine. Students in violation will face disciplinary procedures and/or loss of privileges.

In conjunction with Eau Claire County Health Department and the ECASD School Board, MHS will require all students to wear face coverings while attending the building, until further notice. 'Face covering' means a piece of cloth (e.g., cotton, linen, etc.) or other similar material that is worn to cover the nose and mouth completely. Examples of acceptable face coverings include a cloth face mask, a disposable or paper mask, or a religious face covering. Face covering does NOT include face shields, bandanas, neck gaiter, mesh masks, masks with holes or openings, or masks with vents.

1. During the school day headwear of any type is not to be worn (unless prescribed by a physician due to medical reasons or for documented religious beliefs). Examples include: hats, hoods, bandanas, scarves. Outdoor jackets and coats should not be worn.

2. No student shall be permitted to wear any clothing or jewelry that contains pictures and/or writing referring to alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, sexual references, profanity, promotion of gambling, illegal drugs and/or gangs. Clothing items that cause intimidation or disrupt the learning of others are prohibited. Students will not wear clothing that defames, insults, threatens, harasses or injures any racial or cultural groups or individuals.

3. Students are expected to wear hairstyles and clothing that will not present a health or safety hazard. Special requirements may be necessary in certain areas such as physical education, art, band, science labs, kitchens, and technology education work areas; i.e. safety glasses, aprons, hair nets, etc. Appropriate footwear must be worn unless exceptions are granted.

4. Students will dress in a way that does not endanger themselves or others and will wear clothing that covers their stomachs, chests, backs, buttocks, and undergarments. Tops are not to be worn that are 1) open backed or totally off the shoulder; 2) overly sheer so undergarments can be seen; or 3) low cut so that cleavage is exposed. Tops and bottoms are to touch or overlap. There should be no exposed midriff.



Online Meal Accounts: [myschoolbucks](#) is:

- **Free:** There is no fee for using the service
- **Easy:** Enrolling and funding is simple and completed online
- **Convenient:** Once your account is established, you can check balances and fund the account from your computer or phone
- **Secure:** Your personal and payment card information is protected by the most advanced internet security.
- **Recurring Payments:** With the recurring payment option, SmartPay, money will always be in your child's account. When a low balance is reached, money is automatically deposited.

If you enroll with the recurring payment option called SmartPay, you can set up your child(ren)'s accounts so that a payment will be initiated when their account balance reaches a certain amount. For example, you can set up a recurring payment of \$25.00 when your child(ren)'s account gets to \$8.00. Once you set this up, you will not have to go back into [myschoolbucks](#) unless you change credit/debit cards, your credit card expires, or your student changes schools. The program has been very successful, and based on parent comments, we believe it is a great benefit to our families. If you have questions, you can call [myschoolbucks](#) at 1-800-479-3531.

How to add money to student's lunch account:

Please have money in your student's account prior to the first day of school. Lunch payments may be done in two ways:

1. A check or cash may be placed into the drop slot at Memorial's kitchen (in the door 4 hallway near the commons).
2. Parents may use a credit or debit card to deposit money into a student account through [myschoolbucks](#) Have your student ID

(student log-in ID number, not the Food and Nutrition PIN number) ready when going to [myschoolbucks](#) (Payments may take up to 48 hours to be released to the Eau Claire Area School District from your financial institution. Please plan ahead.)

- Parents may set spending limits, recurring payments and view their students account history at [myschoolbucks](#)



School Breakfast: We are committed to the academic success of all our students. One of the best tools that we can use to help all students succeed is to make sure they eat a healthy and nutritious breakfast, whether at home or at school. If breakfast at home is not convenient, please take advantage of breakfast at school. Studies have shown that students who eat breakfast:

- Perform better in school
- Are tardy less often
- Are more attentive in class
- Are more likely to have better eating habits
- Are less likely to be overweight
- Have decreased absences and trips to the nurse
- Have fewer behavior problems

The School Breakfast Program is available to all students from 7:00-7:30 a.m. While it is your choice of whether your child eats breakfast at home or at school, we do encourage your student to eat a nutritious breakfast. Your student's regular lunch money account will be deducted for all breakfast meals in the same way it is for lunch meals.

WEEKEND MEAL PROGRAM: Feed My People is again partnering with Memorial for the school year to provide this program, which is in many of the elementary and middle schools. It is free and voluntary program for students. There is **no** financial information required. The only requirement for students to participate in the program is a signed permission slip from parent/guardian, because the meals are **not screened** for kids who have food allergies. - Saved as a .jpeg or .tif
- The picture is a portrait image (upright) vs. a landscape image (sideways)
- The picture does not depict violence, alcohol, drugs, or anything that would violate school rules such as a weapon



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NURSING SERVICES

Nursing Services at Memorial High School are provided by a School Nurse and Health Care Assistant. Their offices are located in Student Services. Appointments can be scheduled in advance to discuss chronic health conditions or general health concerns. Although hours vary walk-ins are also welcome as needed.

Additionally, a Public Health Nurse from the Eau Claire City-County Health Department can visit Memorial High School on a consultation basis to provide students and families referrals to appropriate community resources.

STUDENTS WITH HEALTH CONDITIONS

If your child has a health condition that may or will require special monitoring, a health plan, and/or medication to be administered during the school day, please contact your school nurse. Some examples of health conditions could be, but are not limited to: **Allergies, Asthma, ADHD, Cardiac Conditions, Diabetes, and Seizure Conditions.** All medical forms and health plans must be updated at the start of each school year as they do not carry over from year to year. Diet modifications are good for the duration of the student's enrollment in the ECASD.

ECASD Medication Procedures:

Medications should be administered to school children at home, rather than at school, whenever possible.

When medications are needed during the school day, the ECASD policy and guidelines must be followed. These guidelines are in place for the protection of all students. For ANY medication (prescription or over-the-counter) to be allowed in school, a completed Medication Management form with authorization by a physician/licensed prescriber and parent/guardian must be on file with the school nurse. **Medication Management Forms** can be downloaded from the district website on the School Nurse page under the Departments tab of the district website.

The Eau Claire Area School District assumes no responsibility in circumstances where students bring and consume medication at school without benefit of the procedures outlined within the medication policy.

*The **ECASD policy on medications** can be found in Board Policies (#453.4 and 453.4 – Rule) under the Board of Ed tab on the ECASD homepage.*

For any questions about medications or health concerns please call MHS School Nurse 715-852-6470, or MHS Health Aid 715-852-6499.

There are 2 options for medications at school:

1. Parents can request that the medication be administered by a school staff member. The completed form needs to be returned to the school nurse prior to the medication being administered.
 - a. Each prescribed medication must be in its own pharmacy-labeled package which includes the student's name, current date, the correct dosage, time to be taken, and physician/licensed prescriber's name. Nonprescription medications are to be supplied in the original manufacturer's container that lists the ingredients and recommended dose.


Multiple medications should NOT be mixed together in one container.

- b. It is the responsibility of the parent to safely transport the medication to school.
2. Students can carry their own medication. This is not the encouraged practice, but it is allowed as long as these guidelines are followed:
 - a. ECASD Medication management form -written authorization by a physician/licensed prescriber and parent/guardian must be on file with the school nurse. The physician/licensed prescriber must indicate on the form that the student is allowed to carry and self-administer the medication. The completed form needs to be returned to the school nurse prior to the student carrying the medication.
 - b. Each prescribed medication must be in its own pharmacy-labeled package which includes the student's name, current date, the correct dosage, time to be taken, and physician/licensed prescriber's name. Nonprescription medications are to be supplied in the original manufacturer's container that lists the ingredients and recommended dose.

Multiple medications should NOT be mixed together in one container.

- c. It is the responsibility of the student to comply with all school policies/rules relating to student alcohol/drug use.

In all cases the completed form should be returned to the school nurse. Parents are strongly encouraged to return forms to the Student Services office (to the attention of School Nurse) during the month of August to allow time for forms to be reviewed and any needed clarifications to be obtained before the first day of school. The parent/guardian assumes full responsibility for the safe delivery of medications to the health office.



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OLD ABE ATHLETICS

ECASD made the difficult decision to postpone all fall athletics to the spring season of 2021. By doing so, we will fall in alignment with the model provided by the Wisconsin Interscholastic Athletic Association (WIAA). Please be aware this plan will provide the opportunity for student-athletes to take part in all three sports seasons.

In examining the upcoming seasons, school and district administration determined that the district's hybrid instructional model, coupled with the Eau Claire City-County Health Department's current order and its physical distancing requirements, would make it extremely difficult to implement and schedule practices, games, and matches. Based on information and guidance, we believe this was the best decision moving forward to protect community health and safety.

This decision is disappointing news for our student-athletes, coaches, staff, families and fans. As we move forward, our hope is for athletics to resume later this school year. You can anticipate more information to come in the near future.



DIRECTORY INFORMATION

State law allows for the release of student directory data to parties outside the school (including military recruiters and institutions of higher education) unless parents/guardians or adult students request exception to its release. Directory data means records such as student's name, recorded images, student's school, and grade level. An [Opt-Out Form](#) is available for families' use in restricting the release of directory data or you may log into Family Access and update preferences. Families must inform the school that all or part of any directory data may not be released without their prior consent. If you wish to prohibit the release of your child's directory data, you must log into Family Access and update your preferences or complete an [Opt-Out Form](#). The form is available in the main office of each District building and on the District's website under "Forms" at the top of the website. This form will be in effect on the date it is signed and will be valid unless you notify the school that you withdraw all opt-out elections currently on file either by changing your preferences in Family Access or by filling out a new form.

STUDENT DISCRIMINATION COMPLAINTS

If any person believes that the Eau Claire Area School District or any part of the school organization has failed to follow the law and rules of §118.13, Wis. Stats., the Americans with Disabilities Act, Title IX, Title VI, or Section 504 or in some way discriminates against students on the basis of sex; race; religion;


color; national origin; ancestry; immigration status; creed; pregnancy; marital or parental status; physical, mental, emotional or learning disability; or sexual orientation; gender identity or gender expression, he/she can bring or send a complaint to Dr. Kaying Xiong, Director of Student Services, 500 Main Street, Eau Claire, WI 54701. Dr. Xiong can be contacted at 715-852-3036.

Complaints relating to the identification, evaluation, placement or provision of a free appropriate education of a child with a disability shall be resolved by procedures authorized in state and federal law. Also, complaints under federal law commonly referred to as EDGAR complaints (i.e., that the state or a subgrantee is violating a federal statute or regulation that applies to a program) shall be referred directly to the State Superintendent of Schools. Other complaints will follow the steps identified in Board policies (411-Rule) found [HERE](#) or under the Board of Ed tab on the ECASD website.

PEAK ENERGY CONTROL SYSTEM

The district participates in the Peak Energy Rate Program through Excel Energy. The Peak Control Rate (PCR) is an alternative electric rate for customers that are able to shed load during Excel Energy peaks. The risk of the program is that it may affect the school day by needing to close school early. The district will receive at least one-hour notice before the interruption. The district will handle an energy shut-down similar to closing school early for inclement weather. The news media will be contacted immediately so it can report the early closing. As with snow days, parents should have alternate arrangements made for students on days when the district closes early.

Please read the rest of the annual Eagle's Eye for information you need to have on many of the MHS structures, events, notifications, and updated bell schedule for this school year. Given the uniqueness in the reopening of Memorial and our COVID-19 reality, I want to highlight some different rules and routines we are implementing to enhance safety and mitigate risk for your student(s) and our staff.

2020-21 adjustments to highlight:

- Students will be allowed to enter the building at 7:15 a.m. and then are asked to leave immediately at the end of the instructional day.
- Any student that eats breakfast on campus will be asked to do so in their first period classroom.
- Due to COVID-19 constraints, students cannot be allowed to gather before school, over the lunch period, or at the end of the day. Our commons and large gathering spaces have been repurposed for other needs. I ask that students report directly to their classroom upon arrival to the building and during the instructional day.
- Each MHS student will have their 2020-21 first semester class schedule before Sept 1st. Many performance and elective classes (Band and PE, as examples) are only offered 100% virtually this Fall. Some traditional honors course will not be available, due to scheduling constraints. Please work with your Guidance Counselor regarding specific scheduling concerns.
- Due to recommendations from several partner agencies, Memorial will have a closed campus for the lunch periods, during our COVID-19 programming. Students may bring their own lunch or participate in the school lunch program. Ala-Cart options will not be available at the start of the school year.
- Given the adjustment to 74-minute class periods, anticipate multiple lessons, a "flipped classroom" concept and different pedagogical approaches from our instructors.
- Students ***MUST*** use their district issued email. Expect all communication between student and staff through classroom CANVAS learning pages and school email.



Weekend Kids Meals

Dear Memorial Parent/Guardian,

We are happy to inform you that Memorial High School offers the Weekend Kid's Meals Program through our Old Abes Food Pantry in partnership with Feed My People Food Bank. Weekend take home food will be packed from food available in our pantry.

- The purpose of the program is to provide food for your child during the weekend when school breakfasts and lunches are not available.
- There are no income guidelines or requirements. Anyone is welcome to participate in this program. The food is at NO COST to you or your child.
- If you choose to enroll your child, he/she will receive a plastic bag each Tuesday or Friday (depending on their assigned cohort) with enough food for breakfast and lunch for him/her for Saturday and Sunday, plus snacks and fresh fruit when available.
- ***Please be aware that peanut products are often distributed; we apologize that we cannot provide Kid's Meals to those students who have peanut and other food allergies, and they cannot be enrolled.***
- ***Students will need to pick up the weekend meals in Student Services on Tuesdays or Fridays (depending on their assigned cohort) before leaving for the day.***
