LOCAL Scholarships denoted with an **asterisk (*)** symbol indicates that the scholarship will be reviewed and/or awarded by an internal scholarship committee.

Mrs. Lisa Steig, Scholarship Coordinator, posts the scholarship applications as they arrive throughout the school year. Applications and application information is in the scholarship file in Student Services- front counter and on the MHS website-mid center of page.

Although many scholarships are based on grades and test scores, some are based on other criteria such as character, extra-curricular activities, volunteer work, and financial need. It is important to note that scholarships are designed for many types of career interests and GPA's vary.

Tips for Winning Scholarships

- ✓ Do not wait until May of your senior year to start applying for scholarships.
- ✓ Choose references that will say good things about you and give them at least a two to three week to write a letter of recommendation for you. Brag sheets are available in Student Services.
- ✓ Transcripts can be requested through *Parchment* and are free of charge. If you need a hard copy of your transcript, please see Mrs. Steig in student services.
- ✓ Be very neat and follow directions. When possible, always type.
- ✓ Follow deadlines. Applications submitted after deadlines (dates and/or times) will not be accepted.
- ✓ On a scholarship resume, **MORE IS BETTER**. Be sure to include everything you have done since ninth grade (ex. activities, work, leadership)
- ✓ Never pay for scholarship information.

higher, have a SAT combined critical reading and math score of 1200 (based on the old SAT scores) or above and/or ACT composite score of 26 or above. Students must also demonstrate significant unmet financial need.

These scholarships will be awarded to high school seniors who plan to participate in college cooperative education at one of the “partner” institutions listed online. Students must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.5, apply for admission for the 2019-20 academic year, and must meet other merit scholarship criteria as established by the institution.

Douglas D. Hanson Architecture Scholarship

This scholarship is for students who are interested in attending North Dakota University who want to study architecture or landscape architecture. Preference is given to underrepresented ethnic groups in the architecture programs, with priority given to Black/African American and Native American students. Students must have a high school GPA of 3.0 or higher.

The Foundation of WATDA awards 70 to 90 scholarships per year to students attending Wisconsin Technical Colleges for the following technician program:

- Diesel
- Auto Collision
- Motorcycle
- Automotive

Tuition amounts vary and can be up to full tuition. Average tuition awards are \$3,000 (\$750 per semester for four semesters). Snap-on Tool sets may be awarded independently or in conjunction with tuition awards and have a retail value of \$3,905. Students that are not already working in the automotive industry can receive employment assistance. The goal is to have all students working part-time while attending school to get on-the-job training and mentoring to enhance their education experience and graduate with a full-time job!
