I want everyone to know that as always, student success is our number one priority and goal at North High School. Success can be defined differently depending on the student and their goals. When we finish this year up, and congratulate the class of 2024, we plan on all Huskies to be college and career ready.

As we all came out of COVID, attendance and accountability were not considered priorities. Part of being college and career ready is being prepared, organized and punctual. The number one focus of our staff is prioritizing attendance and being on time. This summer, North Administration has been working diligently to implement structures and practices to address student attendance. Simply put, our attendance needs to improve.

Tackling the attendance issues is not done by one person or one group of people but rather our entire community of stakeholders. This means administration, teachers, parents, and students are responsible for change. Procedures that will be implemented on the first day of school on September 1st, will be:

- If students arrive after the 7:35 start, all students will be required to stop and check in with an attendance secretary.
- Please note that during high volume times, you will be asked to wait until you have checked in with an attendance secretary.
- Parents, please excuse your child for pre-arranged absences or within 24 hours of the day of the absence.
- Parents, you can also download the SKYWARD app to excuse your child and save time.
- Students understand that North High is NOT an open campus but an open lunch campus. You are expected to arrive prior to 7:35 and only leave if absolutely necessary. Coming and going at your leisure will not be permitted.
- You may notice an increase in communication from office staff, counselors and administration who will be connecting with families of students who are consistently absent.

As an educator, I know that if students are on time, prepared, and ready to learn, they will have a positive experience. We are all excited to see all the students and to ensure we all have a successful year to gain the post-secondary skills they deserve to be successful in their future endeavors.

FIRST Day Information

Freshmen will report on Wednesday, August 30th from 10:00am – 1:30pm

Led by their Link Crew mentors (upper class students who will periodically facilitate social and scholastic interactions throughout the year), Freshman will participate in orientation activities that will help them make connections with the school and each other.

They will receive a copy of their schedule, meet their teachers, find their Husky Time, and much more! Freshmen only need to bring money for lunch or have money in their lunch account already. Aside from that, everything they will need for this day will be provided for them.

Please see that they bring nothing else...no jackets, backpacks, folders, notebooks, pens, etc. Additionally, students should dress in comfortable clothing so they can sit on the gym floor for some of the activities.

All other students will report on Friday, August 1st

Students who are scheduled for an Early Bird class begin class at 6:35 am. All other students will begin at 7:35 a.m and school will dismiss at 3:00 p.m.

Every class will have a class meeting in the auditorium on September 1st throughout the morning.

For both students and parents, login/password information will remain the same for the 2023–24 school year. If you have forgotten your username and password, you can obtain it by clicking on the SKYWARD link on our website (www.ecasd.us) and choose "Forgot your login/password?" Students will need to bring all materials for the first day of school.

Need to adjust classes?

Students are able to adjust/add classes until September 6th. Up until mid-quarter, students can drop, but not add a class, provided they do not drop below the minimum course load requirements for their grade level. Students who drop a class at this point will be placed in a study hall. They will need to use a "Course Withdrawal" form which can be picked up in Student Services. A parent/guardian signature is required. After mid-quarter, all drops will result in a Withdraw Fail (WF), which will be on the student's permanent transcript as a "WF".



ATTENDANCE POLICIES

Consistent attendance in school is directly related to your student's success academically. In order to help track your student's attendance properly we ask for your help in the following:

- All Students and Visitors must enter through Door 1 to mitigate potential unwelcome visitors and to assure student attendance is as accurate as possible.
- Parents must excuse absences as soon as possible to have accurate attendance
- For unexcused absences, an automated phone call will be made to the student's home the day of an unexcused absence. Families will have up to 14 days to excuse the absence by notifying the attendance office. Administration will send home correspondence if a student's absences become excessive.
- If excused absences exceed 10 days in a school year, the school may notify parents/guardians that further absences will require a doctor's excuse, or they may be marked unexcused.

Parking Lot update

Husky Nation,

I want to take time to prepare everyone for a big change to our parking lot and drop off procedures. Last year, after several complaints, we asked family members to enter the lot at the entrance located across from Mars Avenue. I realized very quickly a few things. One being our lot has not been designed with the intention of having 425 student cars and hundreds of other vehicles coming and going. It for lack of better terms was organized chaos.

This year, we have upgraded signage and purchased other traffic resources to control the chaos. We have also consulted with city planners and safety personnel to try to make the parking lot at North is accessible and efficient. Please understand we will not be asking you to do anything we have not already done in the past. Also, we will be implementing a one way in and one way out practice to help ensure student safety.


- There will be two entrances, not three, into the North Student Lot. (The intersection of Mars & Piedmont and The Doghouse)
- There will be exits located at Piedmont, East of the Mars entrance as well as an exit by the Doghouse.
- There will be NO drop-offs in the back staff only lot.
- Student drop off will begin on the median between the main lot and the Doghouse lot. (Please do not wait to let your student out right at door one.)
- Once you have dropped your student off, please exit East onto Piedmont only if you have entered in from the Mars entrance.
- · Only bus drop off should only happen on Mercury.
- Marquette is also a designated drop off area.


