AP European History: Chapter 11 – Later Middle Ages Overview & Schedule

Although the AP European History National Exam only focuses on materials from 1450 to the present, events of the Late Middle Ages had a great impact on the era to follow. This unit will introduce students to the key influential events and personalities from approximately 1300 to 1500, including the Great Schism, the Black Plague and the Hundred Years' War. Besides providing an overview of the "Dark Ages," this unit will also explore the basics of the AP Exam including the 5 themes and 9 historical thinking skills.

 - What impact did the Black Death have on the society and economy of Europe?
- War and Political Instability
 - What major problems did European states face in the fourteenth century?
- The Decline of the Church
 - How and why did the authority and prestige of the papacy decline in the fourteenth century?
- The Cultural World of the Fourteenth Century
 What were the major developments in literature and art in the fourteenth century?
- Society in an Age of Adversity
 - How did the adversities of the fourteenth century affect urban life and medical practices?
- Evaluate primary and secondary sources using PERSIA (Political, Economic, Religious, Social, Intellectual and Artistic) as a method of analysis
- Introduce Document-Based Question skill of point of view analysis in primary and secondary sources
- Introduce the 5 course themes and 9 historical thinking skills
