# Developing Searches

## Definitions:

- **Database:** An organized collection of information, searchable by computer. Databases are created to make large quantities of information accessible by inputting, storing, retrieving, and managing that information.
- **Keyword:** Any word that shows up in a title, citation, abstract or article text
- **Subject:** Term assigned by an expert to describe **a topic or category** of information.
- **Word Bank:** a list of possible terms to help in your search.

Create a **Word Bank**. Check your spelling.

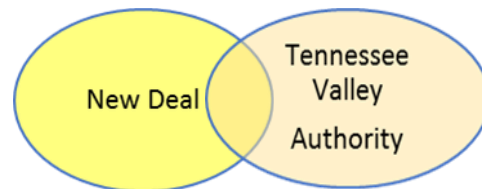
## Location of Memorial's databases:

## TIPS:

- Browse the databases to find a good topic.
- Start with **subject search or advanced search**.
- Use **Truncation**– Use an asterisk (\*) to get multiple endings for the same word. *Child\*= Child, children, Childhood, etc.*
- Develop search strings using **Boolean Operator: AND**
