A student may be considered homeless if he or she is not in stable or adequate housing and is presently living:

- ◆ At another person's residence due to loss of housing, economic hardship or related circumstance
 - ◆ In an emergency or transitional shelter
 - ◆ In a motel, hotel, seasonal trailer park, or campground
 - ◆ Separate from legal parents or guardians
 - ◆ In a car, park, public space, abandoned building, substandard housing, bus or train station, or a similar setting
- ◆ Immediate enrollment in school, even when records are not present at time of enrollment
 - ◆ Continue attending the school of origin (school attended when student became homeless)
 - ◆ Receive transportation assistance to the school of origin (if student is living outside of school's boundaries)
 - ◆ Support for academic success
 - ◆ Free school meals
 - ◆ Assistance acquiring items needed for school

All students identified as living in a homeless situation have the right to:
