## **OPEN ENROLLMENT**

Open Enrollment is February 5 through April 30, 2024

#### What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows students and families who don't live in our district to open enroll into the Eau Claire Area School District.

#### Who May Participate?

Wisconsin residents in grades K-12 may apply to participate in open enrollment. Students in pre-kindergarten may participate in limited circumstances; parents should call the Executive Director of Business Services at 715-852-3010 to find out if their preschoolaged children qualify.

#### **How and When May Parents Apply?**

The regular open enrollment application window will be February 5, 2024, through April 30, 2024, for the 2024-2025 school year. Parents may submit online applications beginning February 5, 2024, at the Wisconsin Department of Instruction website at <a href="https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment">https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment</a>. Have you moved out of the district during the 2023-2024 school year?

If so, you must apply for a Tuition Waiver to continue attending the Eau Claire Area School District for the remainder of the 2023-2024 school year. #### Students Currently Attending the ECASD Through a Tuition Waiver

Students who have moved outside of the district during the 2023-2024 school year and are currently attending school under a Tuition Waiver <u>must</u> apply for open enrollment during the regular application window, February 5, 2024, through April 30, 2024, to continue attending during the 2024-2025 school year.

#### **Current Open Enrollment Students**

Students currently attending the Eau Claire Area School District under the open enrollment law do not need to reapply.

#### **Other Information**

Students who move into the district after January 2024 and anticipate moving out of the district before the 2024-2025 school year will not be eligible for a Tuition Waiver. Students <u>must</u> apply for open enrollment during either the regular open enrollment or alternative open enrollment period to be eligible to attend the Eau Claire Area School District during the 2024-2025 school year.

#### **School Placement**

By completing an open enrollment application, you are applying to attend the Eau Claire Area School District. You have the opportunity to indicate which school your child would prefer to attend; however, the district will determine placement based on space availability.

#### **BOOST SELF-ESTEEM**

February is International Boost Self-Esteem Month. It's common to struggle with self-esteem at some point in our lives. However, turning our thoughts around and thinking positively about ourselves has significant benefits. This month, join us in boosting self-esteem by following these tips.

- 1. **Avoid negative self-talk**. When you spend your days thinking about everything you have done wrong or everything you have failed to do, those thoughts become a part of your internal narrative. They influence your level of self-esteem and the more it continues, the worse you feel. When you catch yourself mulling over every flaw, pause, recognize what you're doing, and work to let it go. Reframe your internal conversation by thinking about a strength.
- 2. **Stop comparing yourself to others**. Former President Theodore Roosevelt said, "Comparison is the thief of joy." The achievements of someone else don't take away from your own. Instead of letting comparison make you feel bad about yourself, take a step back and reflect on how far you have come.
- 3. **Exercise**. When you exercise, your body releases endorphins. These chemicals trigger a positive feeling. Something as simple as taking a short walk each day can improve your mood.
- 4. **Celebrate your strengths**. Take a few minutes each day to think about something you did that you liked. This can be anything from a joke you told to friends, to a meal you helped provide for loved ones, or a skill that helped a client or colleague. Not only will this improve your current mood but looking back on your thoughts can help improve your self-esteem in the long run.

## FAMILY DROP-OFF/PICK-UP

For families who drive their students to/from school, our drop-off and pick-up procedure is outlined below. Remember to proceed SLOWLY AND SAFELY in our lot.

**Before School:** You may drop off your student beginning at 8:30 AM anywhere along the curb within the "horseshoe" lane (the drop-off lane that extends past the Robbins front door). Have your child exit the vehicle from the back seat of the passenger side. When school begins, best to plan for a quick hug or wave and then to morning recess or breakfast. While it can be difficult, we ask that families <u>not</u> go with their children to the playground or into the school. **We also ask that you do not park in the lot and/or cross to the front door; only drop off your child using the drop-off lane.** It's a busy time and we want everyone to stay safe! Our entry bell rings at 8:45 am and our school day begins and attendance is taken at 8:55 am.

After School: At the end of the day, students will line up by grade level or with their oldest sibling's grade level along the horseshoe lane. Please stay in your vehicle in the drop-off lane as children exit the building. As children reunite with their family's vehicle, continue to pull your vehicle forward. We also ask that you do not park in the lot and/or cross to the front door; only pick up your child using the pick-up lane. It's a busy time and we want everyone to stay safe! We recognize the line of cars can get long, but we're happy to report that the whole process takes between 10-15 minutes after the final bell. All

students must be picked up prior to 4:00 pm as we do not have student supervision past that time.

#### **Bus Loading Zone:**

Our bus loading zone if for <u>buses only</u>. Please do not enter the bus loading parking lot between the hours of 8:00 am -9:30 am or between 2:30 pm -4:30 pm.

#### We LOVE learning about money!

The third Monday of February is President's Day. This day recognizes our first president, George Washington's birthday on February 22, but it is also close to Abraham Lincoln's birthday, which is February 12. Both men played such important roles in our country that

we have also honored them by putting their images on our money. George Washington is on both a coin (the quarter) and currency (\$1 bill). Abraham Lincoln is also on a coin (the penny) and currency (\$5 bill).

Did you know that it's against the law for a living president to have their image printed on U.S. currency?

This dates back to Washington's refusal to have his portrait printed on the U.S. dollar. In 1866, this tradition was made law by an act of Congress.

Abraham Lincoln was the first president to be featured on a U.S. coin. Minted in 1909, "Lincoln Pennies" were meant to commemorate the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Lincoln's birth. However, the coins proved so popular that they just never stopped minting them!



We also celebrate Valentine's Day in February! Since we LOVE when students save at Royal Credit Union School \$ense, our special gift this month will be prize bags randomly awarded to two savers depositing on February 14<sup>th</sup>.

### SICK CHILD GUIDELINES

If a child exhibits any of the following symptoms at school, a parent/guardian/emergency contact will be notified to come and pick up the student:

- Fever-Temperature of 100.4 F or more
- Diarrhea
- Vomiting
- Persistent coughing
- Draining or spreading rash

Please keep your child home if he/she currently has or has had any of these symptoms in the last 24 hours.
