- **2018 reservations will be accepted beginning Wednesday, December 6, 2017. (Online 12:00 AM / Walk-Ins 8:00 AM)**

COMMUNITY PARK PAVILION *Park Hours: 4 am - 11 pm*

Monday - Friday Rentals \$ 10 per hour
Saturday & Sunday Rentals \$ 15 per hour

***No open flames are permitted under the pavilion or within 25' of other combustible material**

PHOENIX PARK *Park Hours: 4 am - 11 pm*

Monday - Friday Rentals \$ 10 per hour
Saturday & Sunday Rentals \$ 20 per hour

***Alcohol and amplified sound must end at sunset in Phoenix Park**

NEIGHBORHOOD PAVILION/SHELTER *Park Hours: 4 am - 11 pm*

- Monday - Sunday Rentals \$ 10 per hour
- Fee waived for Neighborhood Association meetings.
- Some neighborhood shelters may be booked throughout the summer for recreation programs.

FOREST HILL & LAKEVIEW CHAPELS **\$180/2 hour block**

- Additional time may be reserved (\$90/hour).
- Additional charges (overtime after 4 pm & weekends).
- Rentals can only be made in person, fax or mail at the Parks & Recreation Office.
- Forest Hill Chapel reservable for memorial services only.

FAIRFAX POOL

Group rentals are available during summer season (June-August). See the Fairfax Pool section of the summer Prime Times for more information or visit www.eauclairewi.gov/pool. Pool rentals can only be made in person, fax, or mail to the Parks & Recreation Office.

ALCOHOL PERMITS

- Up to 2 half barrels allowed / \$40 per reservation.
- Alcohol is *not allowed* at any neighborhood park or Owen Park.
- Alcohol is *not allowed* in Phoenix Park without completing an Alcohol Application for Phoenix Park and approval from the Community Services Director.
- Beer Keg Permits must be purchased 10 days prior to the event.

REFUND POLICY

- Refunds will only be given when notice of cancellation is received 5 business days prior to the event.
- A \$5 administrative fee will be deducted for all cancelled reservations.


FIRE PIT POLICY

- Fire pits are allowed in parks as long as fire pit is elevated and provided by user.
- Fire pits are Not provided by Parks & Recreation.
- Burning permit is required from the Fire Department prior to event.
- Users must notify Parks & Recreation of intent to use a fire pit.

ATHLETIC FACILITY RESERVATIONS

Athletic facility reservations are scheduled through the Administrative Office at (715) 839-5032. Please note the following guidelines.

- Practices are NOT scheduled at outdoor City Facilities and UWEC Bollinger Athletic Complex. Athletic facilities are first come, first serve. EXCEPTION: When ball fields are lined this indicates the field has been reserved and fees paid by another user. When this happens, please refrain from use and find an alternate location.
- Priority scheduling accommodates lease holders, organizations with agreements, and schools prior to other events, groups and individuals.
- Reservation fees apply. Reservations submitted within two weeks of the event will be charged an additional fee. Changes to approved schedules are charged an additional fee for each request, except for weather related changes.
- A 72 hour cancellation notice is required to avoid additional charges.

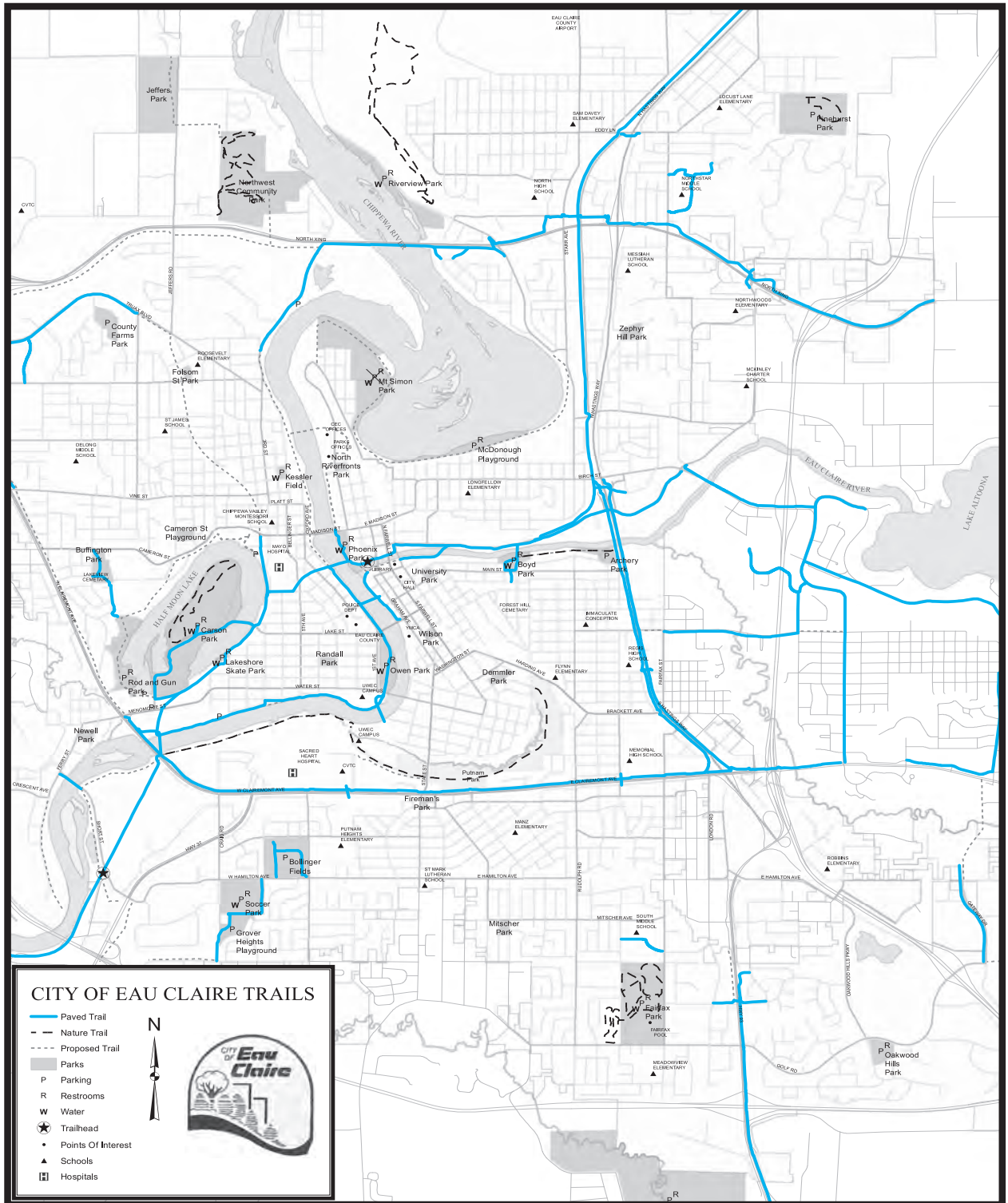

FORESTRY SERVICES

The goal of the Urban Forestry Program is to provide residents with all the physical and psychological benefits that are derived from an abundant, healthy, and safe community forest.

Management practices include:

- Maximize tree cover on both public and private property.
- Provide optimum stocking of boulevard areas while staying within budget limitations.
- Create diversity of species composition.
- Create diversity in the age structure.
- Maximize the longevity of individual trees.
- Minimize tree hazards.
- Improve the health and safety of the private portion of the urban forest through education, on-site advice, and by example, using only proper arboricultural techniques on public trees.

Consultations:

The Forestry Division offers consultations for sidewalk and curb conflicts with boulevard trees. This program is intended to abate the conflicts before sidewalks or other hardscapes are beyond a repairable state, and to maintain the integrity of our Urban Forestry canopy. Homeowners who have concerns about heaved sidewalks may contact the Forestry Division. Staff will look for remediation options, up to and including removal of problematic trees. This program is voluntary, and the City will incur the cost of the tree care deemed fit. With this, the City will also offer a replanting option where appropriate as determined by Staff with species that are correct for the space. Replacement of sidewalk or curb will still be incumbent upon the property owner.

PARENT/CHILD AQUATICS

(AGE: 6 MONTH - 4 YEARS)

An adult is REQUIRED to participate in the water with each child. Registration Deadline: 12:00 PM on the Friday BEFORE the class starts.

PARENT/CHILD LEVEL 1

Prerequisites: Be 6 months of age before the first class.

Goal: Familiarize children with water, teaching swimming readiness skills, building safe habits for aquatic environments, educating parents on how to safely supervise and enjoy the water with their children.

PARENT/CHILD LEVEL 2

Prerequisites: Participant MUST attain 6 months of age before the first class AND successfully complete Parent Child Level 1 OR confidently explore the water with support (on front and back) and submerge the mouth, eyes, and nose.

Goal: Children learn when and how to safely enter and exit the water, develop breath control, gain comfort with a feeling of buoyancy, learn arm and leg actions for swimming, and continue building safe habits for aquatic environments including: the expectation of parent supervision and what to do in an emergency. Provides parents with safety information and techniques they can use to help their children in the water.

PRESCHOOL AQUATICS

(AGE: 4-5 YEARS) A parent is NOT required to attend.

Registration Deadline: 12:00 PM on the Friday BEFORE the class starts.

OTTER

Prerequisites: Be 4 years of age before the first class.

Goal: Learn when and how to independently enter and exit the water, develop breath control, experience and gain comfort with buoyancy on the front and back, practice beginner arm and leg action on the front and back, prepare to safely participate in aquatic activities, learn how to recognize emergencies and call for help.

SEAL

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Otter (American Red Cross Preschool Aquatics Level 1) or be able to do the following using support as needed: 1) independently enter the water, move 5 yards through the water, submerge to their mouth and blow bubbles for 3 seconds, and safely exit the water; 2) glide on their front for 2 body lengths, roll to back and float for 3 seconds, then recover to vertical.

Goal: Begin to independently float, glide, and move through the water with minimal assistance. Perform previous skill for longer lengths of time or longer distances, explore deeper water, prepare to safely participate in aquatic activities, learn how to recognize emergencies and call for help.

DOLPHIN

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Seal (American Red Cross Preschool Aquatics Level 2) or be able to do the following with MINIMAL assistance: 1) glide on front 2 body lengths, roll to back, float 5 seconds recover to vertical; 2) glide on back for 2 body lengths, roll to front, recover to vertical; 3) Swim (using arm and leg actions) on front for 3 body lengths, roll to back, float for 5 seconds, roll to front, swim on front for 3 body lengths.

Goal: Gain increasing independence and endurance while swimming, floating, and gliding, explore treading water, learn more about safely participating in aquatic environments, learn how to safely respond once help is on the way.

RED CROSS LEARN TO SWIM

(AGE 6+ YEARS)

Note: Children who have participated in preschool aquatics classes use the following chart to choose your level:

Otter=Level 1 Seal=Level 2 Dolphin=Level 3

(Last level completed = Learn to swim level)

Registration Deadline: 12:00 PM on the Friday BEFORE the class starts.

Level 1

Prerequisites: Be 6 years of age before the first class.

Goal: Orient children to the aquatic environment, teach basic aquatic skills, prepare children to safely participate in aquatic activities, teach how to recognize emergencies and call for help.

Level 2

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Level 1 OR be able to do the following: 1) Independently enter the water safely, travel 5 yards through the water, bob 5 times and safely exit; 2) Glide on front for 2 body lengths, roll to a back float for 5 seconds and recover to vertical. A wall may be used during Part 1. Instructor may provide MINIMAL assistance Part 2.

Goal: Begin to independently float, glide, and move through the water. Perform previous skill for longer lengths of time or longer distances, explore deeper water, and prepare to safely participate in aquatic activities, learn how to recognize emergencies, call for help, and safely respond once help is on the way.

Level 3

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Level 2 OR be able to do the following: 1) Step into chest deep water, push off the bottom, tread or float for 15 seconds, swim on front/back for 5 body lengths, and exit the water; 2) Move into a back float, float 15 seconds, and return to vertical; 3) Push off, swim (using arm and leg actions) on front for 5 body lengths, roll to back, float for 15 seconds, roll to front, swim on front for 5 body lengths.

Goal: Perform previous skills for longer lengths of time or longer distances; introduction to the front crawl, elementary

backstroke, and head first entries; develop water competency; learn how to stay safe near frozen/cold bodies of water, safely swim underwater, and choose where/when to exit the water.

Level 4

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Level 3 OR be able to do the following: 1) Jump into deep water, recover to the surface, tread/float 1 minute, turn 360° and orient to exit point, level off, swim 25 yards front crawl/back crawl and exit the water. 2) Push off in a streamlined position, swim front crawl 15 yards, swim 15 yards elementary backstroke, and exit the water.

Goal: Perform previous skills with greater proficiency and build endurance; introduction to the back crawl, breaststroke, sidestroke, butterfly, and turning at the wall; practice using equipment in an emergency, and survival floating.

Level 5

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Level 4 OR be able to do the following: 1) Jump or step into deep water, swim front crawl 25 yds., swim elementary backstroke 25 yds., and exit the water, 2) Swim breaststroke 15 yds., swim back crawl 15 yds, 3) Submerge and swim 3-5 body lengths under a water, surface and exit.

Goal: Perform previous skills with greater proficiency and build endurance; introduction to flip turns on front and back; perform a long shallow dive, surface, and begin swimming; develop a safety first attitude towards water parks; understand the importance of First Aid & CPR.

Level 6

Prerequisites: Successfully complete Level 5 OR be able to do the following: 1) Perform a long shallow dive, swim 50 yds. front crawl, then swim elementary backstroke 50 yds. 2) Swim 25 yds. breaststroke, then swim back crawl 25 yds.

Goal: Stroke Refinement for greater efficiency and effectiveness over longer distances; focus on personal water safety and the skills necessary to become a Water Safety Instructor Lifeguard; as time allows skills for fitness swimming and spring board diving will be introduced.

LIFEGUARD TRAINING

This Red Cross course trains and certifies successful participants in American Red Cross Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED. The lifeguard certification requires a standard number of hours for classroom, pool, and online training. Successful completion requires that participants are PRESENT FOR ALL CLASS SESSIONS; complete all online training modules, attain 80% on the written exam, and demonstrate proficiency in all skills.

Prerequisites: A) Students must be 15 years old by the completion of this course. B) The ability to swim at least 300 yards continuously demonstrating breath control and rhythmic breathing using front crawl or breast stroke. C) The ability to tread water for 2 minutes using only the legs. D) Successful completion of a timed event in 1 minute, 40 seconds. The Timed Event requires participants to: 1) Surface dive, feet-first or head-first, to a depth of 7-10 feet, 2) retrieve a 10 pound object, 3) surface and swim 20 yards on their back with the object (Both hands must remain on the object throughout), 4) exit the water without using the ladder or steps. Upon successful completion, participants receive a Red Cross certificate that indicates completion of Lifeguarding/First Aid/CPR/AED class and is valid for 2 years.

CROSS COUNTRY SKI TRAILS

The City of Eau Claire grooms and maintains four cross-country ski trails inside the City limits. These include:

CITY WELLS AREA

This area is located on the east side of Riverview Drive directly across from Riverview Park. The trail is flat and is approximately three miles in length.

FAIRFAX PARK

Located on the City's south side just off of Golf Road is a trail approximately 1.7 miles in length. Skiers may park in the Pine Meadow Golf Course parking lot or the Fairfax Pool parking lot and access the trail on the north side of the park road.

CARSON PARK

A one-mile closed loop course is groomed and maintained in Carson Park. This loop can be accessed off the main parking lot. The terrain is rolling with one hill.

PINEHURST PARK

This area is located on the City's north side on Delbert Road and is a part of the Pinehurst Winter Recreation Area. The trail is slightly less than 1 mile in length and has multiple hills.



PINEHURST WINTER RECREATION AREA

This is a great local destination for Chippewa Valley residents of all ages to snowboard, downhill ski, and tube. Construction and renovations started in 2013 and are still in progress to expand this park and make it better than ever.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Most programs have enrollment limits. Early registration is encouraged. Most programs for which a fee is charged require pre-registration. Sales tax is included in the program fee.

REFUNDS

- A full refund will be made to you for any programs cancelled by Eau Claire Parks and Recreation.
- A full refund will be made to you if there are any changes to the original schedule and you can no longer participate.
- A refund will be made to you for most programs when Parks and Recreation is notified of your cancellation 72 hours prior to the start of the program. (Less a \$5 administration fee.)
- Refunds will not be issued for cancellations after 72 hours or after the start of the class/program/facility rental.
- Refunds will only be given when notice of facility reservation cancellation is received 5 business days prior to the event.
- Refunds will not be issued for Fairfax Pool Passes, City Passes, or Amusement Park Tickets.
- Refunds will not be issued for Adult Athletic Team registration fees after schedules have been completed.
- Youth Leagues - 75% of the program fee may be refunded up to the first day of program. After games begin no refunds will be issued.
- All transfers/cancellations must be done via phone or in person 72 hours prior to the first class to receive a refund. There are no guarantees with email notifications.
- No refunds or credits will be kept on your account. If your account is credited with a refund or an overpayment is made, you will be issued a check in 1-2 weeks.

CLASS CANCELLATIONS

A minimum number of students are required before a class can be offered. Parks and Recreation reserves the right to cancel a class or make schedule changes when enrollment does not reach the minimum number.

INSURANCE

Parks and Recreation does not provide accident or hospital insurance for people participating in sponsored activities. All participants should review their personal insurance policies for coverage.

AGE REQUIREMENTS

For all youth programs the age will be as of the first day of the program. Parents, please, do not ask to have your child put in a class he/she does not belong in. All age requirements are set to benefit the children and to make instruction easier for the program leader. In some instances, age requirements have been set for your child's safety. Thank you for your cooperation.

WE LOVE PARENTS

But... with your child's best interest in mind, parents are invited to attend their child's midterm and last class meeting only (instructional programs). Our instructors have found that the quality of instruction is affected by parent and/or sibling distractions and interruptions. We feel it is most beneficial for your child to have recreational time with his/her peers. Instructors welcome the opportunity to discuss participants' progress with parents.

NON-CITY RESIDENT POLICY

Recreation programs and activities that are not part of summer school offerings are supported by City property taxes. Non-City residents will be required to pay their "fair share" to support activities. The program fee for non-residents will be double the resident fee or an additional \$10, whichever is less. A non-resident is considered anyone who lives outside of the City limits (ie: township/county). Unfortunately, our registration software cannot always decipher if addresses are located within the Eau Claire

City limits. For this reason, all participant addresses are reviewed during each season. Invoices will be sent to non-residents that pay the resident fee.

YOUTH SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Area businesses and community groups in Eau Claire support our scholarship program for low-income families. Any family that can provide proof of effective Food Share Quest Card (paperwork showing effective date) or an ECASD Free Lunch Letter, proof of residency (driver's license with current address or utility bill with name and address) and is a City of Eau Claire resident qualifies. Call the Recreation Office for application materials or go to our website. If you would like to donate to our scholarship fund, please call the Recreation Office for information.

PHOTO/VIDEO POLICY

Eau Claire Parks and Recreation provides programs in facilities and on property open to the public. Parks and Recreation staff may photograph or videotape participants enrolled in its programs for promotional or training purposes. These photographs or videos are the sole property of the City of Eau Claire.

LOST & FOUND ITEMS

All items of value are brought to the Parks and Recreation Administrative office and stored up to one year. Every attempt is made to contact the owner when possible. Items of value may include but are not limited to; wallets, purses, driver's license, cell phones, and jewelry. Other items found at facilities, programs, or events will be kept at the site until the end of the season. After that time, all items will be brought to the Central Maintenance Facility where they are sorted and donated to a local charity. Fairfax Pool has a one-week policy for holding lost and found items due to the nature of items that are found. At that time they are either disposed of or donated to a local charity.

CONCUSSION INFORMATION

Forms will be available during the registration process for all youth athletic leagues as referenced by Wis. State Statute: At the beginning of a season for a youth athletic activity, the person operating the youth athletic activity shall distribute a concussion and head injury information sheet to each person who will be coaching that youth athletic activity and to each person who wishes to participate in that youth athletic activity. No person may participate in a youth athletic activity unless the person returns the information sheet signed by the person and, if he or she is under the age of 19, by his or her parent or guardian.

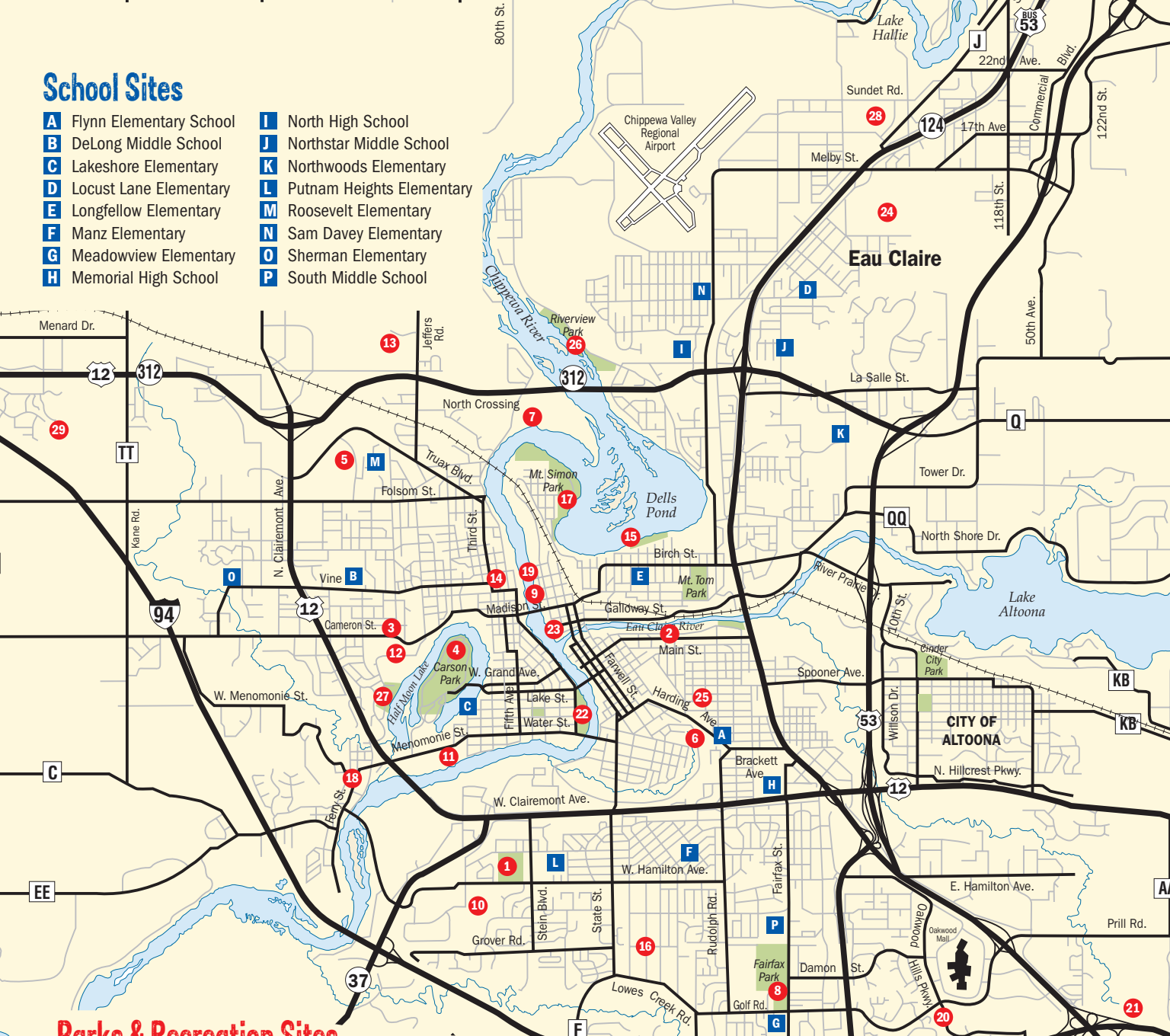
