PurposeFull Pursuits: Create a simple sign with some emotion words or faces/emojis. Create a space where your family can see emotion words or faces in 1 place near an entrance of a space. Each time someone walks through the entrance this week, have them tap the emotion they are feeling and name their feelings Honestly. Work together to help regulate or manage those emotions to be more confident, calm, or focused.

Conversation Starter: Share with me how being Honest with ourselves can help us to be more confident, calm, or focused.
