Mindful Moment: Test Preparation!

Here are some ways you can encourage your student before the test: get a good night's sleep the night before, eat a nutritious breakfast or snacks before taking the test. You might try asking your student about coping strategies they've used and what works for them- maybe playing a game, making art, reading, or going for a walk helps them at the end of day. These might be activities you could try at home to help your student manage any stressful feelings they have about FORWARD testing?

Character Trait Connection

April's character trait is Courage! We are learning that Courage is choosing what is helpful, right, and kind even when it is hard or scary. One way we are practicing courage this month at Flynn is by learning how to ask for help when we need it. This is even a skill that adults struggle with- and that's okay!! A conversation starter your family could try at home might be asking members of your family about a time during their week that they showed Courage.
