*Grades K-2* have been learning about safety in our recent classroom counseling lessons. Our safety mascot, Charlie Check First reminds us to "Check first before you go anywhere with anyone." We have also played the thumbs up/ thumbs down safety game where we decide if something is safe and ok, OR if it is unsafe and gives us an "uh oh feeling." 1<sup>st</sup> Grade will soon have a special lesson with School Resource Officer, Officer Chapin to continue talking about safety.

In Grades K-2, we have also started working through our safety workbooks. One section of our workbook focuses on learning phone numbers and addresses. K-2 students will be bringing a copy of this page home to practice with their adults to learn their phone numbers and addresses. This page does *not* need to be returned to school and you are welcome to tape it in a spot at home where your student can see and practice memorizing it everyday!

*Grades 3-5* have continued learning about making healthy choices, peer pressure refusal strategies, and stress management. 5<sup>th</sup> Grade will have a special lesson with School Resource Officer Chapin towards the end of April and in early May, the South Middle School Counseling Team will meet with 5<sup>th</sup> grade to talk about MIDDLE SCHOOL!
