On October 29, 2009, Flynn became an International Peace Site. This is designation is foundational to the culture of Flynn. September 21 is the annual International Day of Peace. After our September 21 family social, students will go outside for morning recess, then line up with the morning bell at 8:40 AM, and then gather around the Peace Pole in front of Flynn. We will have a short ceremony celebrating International Peace Day, Flynn's designation, and our upcoming service project.

One of the Five Peace Actions for International Peace Sites is reaching out in service. Flynn students will be doing that this fall as they raise money for our playground improvements that support the school and neighborhood communities. Stay tuned for "Penny for Peace" that will kick off that process.

We are administering our Star assessments this week. These are valuable assessments, as they help us determine the supports each student needs to be successful. As with any assessment, being well rested and having a good breakfast are the foundations for students doing their best.

Finally, our staff is implementing our "first six weeks" plan to prepare students for social and emotional success throughout the year. This includes:

- Week 1: Build community and establish classroom routines.
- Week 2: Continue week #1, and add work on classroom rules
- Week 3: Continue weeks #1 & 2, and begin work on instructional/logical consequences, and begin focus on independence
- Weeks 4, 5, and 6: Build off first three weeks, and increase independence by providing appropriate leadership roles

September is all about RESPECT.

Listening is an important skill that is harder than it sounds. We fail to listen not because we don't hear but rather because we don't focus or pay attention to what we are

hearing. Listening is a sign of Respect. It shows that you value what the speaker has to say. This month's focus for is on practicing Respect through Strong Listening.

We will learn and practice these Strong Listening strategies at school. **Try them at** home with your student!

- 1. Eyes are ready (point to your eyes)
- 2. Ears are listening (cup your ears)
- 3. Brain is focused (point to your brain)
- 4. Heart is caring (put your hand on your heart)

Conversation Starter:

- Can you share or show what Respect means?
- Why do you think it is important to use Strong Listening when practicing Respect?

- 1. **Communicate**: Check in with your child(ren) often. Acknowledge your child's fears and let them know you understand and that it's normal to feel anxious.
- 2. Encourage In-Person Social Interactions: Spending time with friends outside of school can make the transition smoother and more enjoyable.
- Create and Continue Routines: Establishing bedtimes, eating healthy meals, and setting aside time for homework and relaxation can help your child adjust to the school year.
