In classroom counseling lessons, Kindergarten began learning about something called the *Group Plan;* this is when everyone is doing the same thing and having the same thoughts. In our lesson, we read about some kids who were helping to make apple pie and ice cream, but they needed to work together on the group plan to accomplish their tasty goal! We also played a game called Apple Scramble where we got to practice our plan of getting all the apples into the bucket!

Second grade continued conversations about empathy and began talking about triggers. Triggers are things that cause our emotion levels to change and make us feel frustrated, mad, upset or worried. A good question to ask when talking about triggers is "What is one thing you can do this week when you experience this trigger?" Asking yourself (or your kiddo) this question in a neutral setting can help you make a plan for the future and feel more successful navigating big emotions.

Mindful Moment: Mental Rehearsal

Perseverance is our character trait this month. If you're working through something challenging, or supporting someone through a challenging event, give Mental Rehearsal a try! First, close your eyes. Next, imagine what you need to do in your mind. Then, picture what you need to succeed and see yourself doing an AWESOME job! The beginning of a new year is a great time to work on further developing good habits and setting goals. One goal that is great to set and

work towards is an "I'm saving for..." goal. It can be a challenge that's fun to work on and enjoy as a family. Using a goal chart like the one here can provide a visual that helps encourage your child as they save money each week.
