First of all, we would like to THANK all Old Abe families and caregivers for everything you are doing at home to



support your child's education and mental health. You are doing a great job! To support you more at home we created this article which is the first of many more just for you.

Some things to try:

Make open and intentional communication a priority with your teen. Close the computer if you can or set the phone down to show your teen you are focused only on what they have to say. This is a great way to build family/child bonds and your teen will notice this!

get up and get dressed. Get ready for school. Help teen create a schedule for school days and post in a visible place so family knows schedule. For ex: Monday and Tuesdays, teen as live class session between 9 and 10:30. (Helps with organization too)

Promote Positives: Limit negative social media/news and <u>promote positives</u>. While we want to hear concerns and worries, teens and families need to know there is still a lot goodness in the world today.

Practice Gratitude and Mindfulness: For ex: Family can take turns daily and <u>name three things</u> you are **grateful for today.** (Mindfulness) Practice three deep breaths. Be in the moment. Self-care is critical for teens/families/caregivers too. We thank you and know families, caregivers, and teens are giving your very best every day during the pandemic.

Attention Parents/Guardians of Students who are Enrolled in an Advanced Placement (AP) Course



Last year, students enrolled in an AP course, who wanted to take the AP exam in May, had to register and pay in November to take the AP exam in May. If they did not, they were charged an additional \$40 per exam by College Board.

This year that penalty was eliminated by College Board, the testing company. In February, you will receive a letter and registration form in the mail and through email about registering and paying for the exam should your student decide to test. This

information will also be shared with your student. Please be mindful of this upcoming event in February. Testing is not required, however, encouraged. Students do not receive college credit for taking the class. They only receive college credit if they take and pass the exam. Each exam costs \$95 and there are fee waivers for those that qualify. FREE Breakfast and Lunch




Boys Basketball Information

Memorial High School Serves as a New Drive-up Antigen Testing Site



Beginning Saturday, November 14, MHS parking lot will serve as a drive-up antigen testing site on Saturdays, Sundays, and Wednesdays from 12 – 8pm. This short-term site has been established to help identify asymptomatic spread of the virus in our area. Read more about the testing HERE.

This testing site is suited for people over the age of 5 who are **NOT** experiencing symptoms. **Tests are FREE! Registration on the day of the test is required at** https://www.doineedacovid19test.com/.

People who are experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should visit with their healthcare provider or one of the local National Guard testing sites to get a COVID-19 test.

This antigen testing site has been made available thanks to a partnership between the Eau Claire Area School District, UW-Eau Claire, and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services. 
