I enjoy music. All kinds. Even the "stuff these kids are listening to these days." This was a hobby passed down from my dad who enjoyed and could appreciate music from all different styles, influences, and genres. As the weather changes and we look to the indoors for more entertainment, I make my way back to music. While I enjoy listening to music on my short commute to work or at the gym, listening to music while not engaging in another task is different. As the weather becomes cooler and the nights become longer, this hobby returns. The enjoyment of music also means a time to dust off vinyl, warm up the tubes on my amplifier, and enjoy the spinning of records.

November at Northstar Middle School has similar parallels to listening to music through a turntable. What stands out to me is "the groove." Like the needle (or cartridge) on a turn table finds the groove as the record spins and creates sound (ala music), our school is like the relationship between the needle and the record. Now that we have hit our groove, we focus as a school community on what our students need to find success here at school academically and socially.

At Northstar, we want all students to move forward in their learning, especially when they face setbacks. Our staff are here to partner with you to help students complete assignments, stay organized, and provide extra guidance and support. If your student feels as if their educational "groove" is not in place, and the distance between the needle and the record is getting bigger and bigger, please consider the following supports:

- 1) Join Polar Club- Northstar's Polar Club is our after-school study club that meets each Monday, Tuesday, and Thursday from 2:55-4:00 pm. Students have access to our computer lab, library materials, and help from Northstar staff. It even includes a complimentary snack for each student. Permission slips can be picked up and returned to the Student Services office.
- 2) Access Skyward Family Access– If you have not already set up a Skyward Account, please visit our school district's website at www.ecasd.us and click on "Skyward" at the top of the homepage to create an account. Skyward allows families to access their child's grades and receive messages from teachers regarding upcoming assignments and class events. This also helps guide your ongoing "How was school today?" conversations at home.
- 3) Backpack Check(s)- Middle school is the first time our students carry materials between classes. Organization is a precious skill that leads to success and confidence, help your student organize their backpack at home and ask to see their planner each day. This will help decrease the number of lost or missing assignments and lead to their success.
