
### Highlights from February:

- Our Second-Grade Students enjoyed the Eau Claire Children's Theatre performance of *The Cat in the Hat* at the Oxford. Thank you to our PTA and families for supporting this wonderful opportunity for our kids!
- As a culminating activity celebrating our school-wide focus on *honesty*, Roosevelt students enjoyed a *Bingo for Books* activity with their buddy classrooms on February 28! It was great to see so many kids thrilled to head home for the weekend with a newly chosen book.
- All Roosevelt students and staff members participated in *Tiger Tuesdays* throughout February. As a school, we were able to raise over \$2438.83 with 100% of the proceeds going towards our playground updates for phase-two. Our winning grade-level was our fifth grade, who have earned themselves a bonus recess and special treat in April! Thank you to everyone who were able to contribute to this fundraiser. Our Roosevelt Playground Taskforce has raised approximately \$80,000 over the past 2.5 years with phase-one being installed last summer. We are approximately \$25,000 away from completing the entire project, and really appreciate your support! Here are some ways you can help:



- Support you child during our March *Read-a-thon*! This fundraiser is directed towards our general PTA account with all budget overages going towards our playground fundraiser.

- Donate baskets of items that could be auctioned off during our *Spaghetti Dinner's* silent auction.

- We reviewed, analyzed, and are planning around results from our *Winter Student Equity Survey*. Students in grades 2-5 were asked to respond to five specific questions with either (a) strongly agree, (b) agree, (c) disagree, or (d) strongly disagree.
  - Strength: 92% of our students agree or strongly agree that they "feel cared for and safe at school."
  - Strength: 97% of our students agree or strongly agree that "adults at school expect me to do my best at school."
  - **Strength:** 97% of our students agree or strongly agree that they *"understand their teachers' directions and know their job at school."*
  - **Room For Growth:** 26% of our students either disagree or strongly disagree that they *"feel adults at school treat all students with fairness"*, which indicates that we need to be more clear and consistent with our student expectations each day.
  - **Room For Growth:** 21% of our students either disagree or strongly disagree that they *"feel adults at school treat all students with respect"*, which indicates that we need to continually keep our interactions with students positive whenever possible, especially when redirecting behavior.
- Thank you to our families who recently completed the *Winter Family Equity Survey*. We are still in the process of entering responses and will soon have family feedback to also review, analyze, and plan around as a school team. We plan to use the same survey questions for the next 3-5 years each fall, winter, and spring to gauge our long-range progress as a school. Thank you again for your honest feedback! Results from our *Winter Family Equity Survey* will be shared in our April newsletter.

- On **Tuesday, March 12**, ECASD families have the special opportunity to attend the <u>SENSE Special Education PTO</u> <u>Resource Fair</u> taking place at the L.E. Phillips Public Library.
- Last fall, the *Special Education PTO (S.E.N.S.E.)* also hosted internationally recognized presenter Ryan Wexelblatt who shared excellent parenting tips that not only apply to raising kids who have been diagnosed with ADHD, but his suggestions would also apply to **ALL** kids who have difficulty focusing, staying organized, or thinking before doing, with or without a diagnosis of ADHD. - Speaking of reading...we will be completing our fourth-annual *Read-a-thon* on **Tuesday**, **March 19**! The money raised from this fundraiser will go towards our PTA's general fund to support our students and teachers throughout the year. Some of the programs our PTA funds are extra grade level field trips, teacher mini grants, Sport Warehouse night, our school dance, Roosevelt t-shirts for all students and staff every other year, the holiday workshop, end of the year carnival, etc. Please check your child's folder for their *Read-a-thon* sheet with their class code which needs to be entered to participate. Our school goal this year is to reach **18,000 total minutes** reading and **\$3,200 in**

**donations**. When we reach this, we will plan a bonus recess with buddy classrooms with a special frozen treat to enjoy!

Throughout the month of March, our character trait to focus on is cooperation. We describe cooperation as "working together and helping others." We will be shifting from our February Tiger Tuesdays, which was focused on helping us raise funding for our playground, to <u>Teamwork</u> <u>Tuesdays</u>, which will be focused on helping others. With a school goal of providing 500 or more non-perishable food items to our local food banks, we know we can do great things when we work as a team! On April 2, our



cooperative students of the week will be taking a walking field trip to the *St. Francis Food Pantry* to deliver everything that is collected. Thank you for your help in supporting your child's social-emotional learning and while also supporting those in need!



Roosevelt Elementary School will host in-person summer school June 10-27 (Monday-Thursday, 8:30-11:45am) with free breakfast, free lunch, and library times available. Our summer school program is also free to families and designed for ALL students going into grades Kindergarten through fifth grade regardless of academic or behavioral needs. Registration for summer school is currently open in *Skyward Family Access*. To ensure guaranteed busing, families must register no later than Friday, March 29. # Wisconsin Public School

## Open Enrollment is February 5 through April 30, 2024

#### What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows students and families who don't live in our district to open enroll into the Eau Claire Area School District.

#### Who May Participate?

Wisconsin residents in grades K-12 may apply to participate in open enrollment. Students in pre-kindergarten may participate in limited circumstances; parents should call the Executive Director of Business Services at 715-852-3010 to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify.

#### How and When May Parents Apply?

The regular open enrollment application window will be February 5, 2024, through April 30, 2024, for the 2024-2025 school year. Parents may submit online applications beginning February 5, 2024, at the Wisconsin Department of Instruction website at <a href="https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment">https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment</a>. Please call 715-852-3127 or email <a href="https://dpi.wi.gov/open-enrollment">districtadministration@ecasd.us</a> for more information.

#### Have you moved out of the district during the 2023-2024 school year?

If so, you must apply for a Tuition Waiver to continue attending the Eau Claire Area School District for the remainder of the 2023-2024 school year. Contact the Enrollment Office at 715-852-3127 or email <u>districtadministration@ecasd.us</u> for an application.

#### Students Currently Attending the ECASD Through a Tuition Waiver

Students who have moved outside of the district during the 2023-2024 school year and are currently attending school under a Tuition Waiver <u>must</u> apply for open enrollment during the regular application window, February 5, 2024, through April 30, 2024, to continue attending during the 2024-2025 school year.

#### **Current Open Enrollment Students**

Students currently attending the Eau Claire Area School District under the open enrollment law do not need to reapply.

#### Other Information

Students who move into the district after January 2024 and anticipate moving out of the district before the 2024-2025 school year will not be eligible for a Tuition Waiver. Students <u>must</u> apply for open enrollment during either the regular open enrollment or alternative open enrollment period to be eligible to attend the Eau Claire Area School District during the 2024-2025 school year.

#### **School Placement**

By completing an open enrollment application, you are applying to attend the Eau Claire Area School District. You have the opportunity to indicate which school your child would prefer to attend; however, the district will determine placement based on space availability.
