

AVID is an acronym for Advancement Via Individual Determination. Its mission is to close the opportunity gap by preparing all students for college readiness and success in a global society.

South is a Certified AVID School! This means that we have met AVID's implementation expectations to support program effectiveness and student progress, bringing us closer to our goal of closing opportunity gaps and supporting the district's goal of preparing students for post-secondary success! The AVID Elective is a yearlong 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade elective that prepares students in the academic middle for admission to a four-year college or university. Students in an AVID Elective course are provided with skills needed to be successful in advancing academically. For more than 30 years, AVID has been instrumental in preparing students for higher education. AVID Elective is a yearlong elective that will replace other elective(s).

The AVID Elective supports students who challenge themselves in more rigorous classes. Students are taught study skills, note-taking, time management, writing, and research skills while being immersed in a college-going culture. The class also includes tutoring sessions that are led by peers and/or college students and provide support for success in the academically rigorous curriculum. Additionally, the AVID Elective provides access to information about colleges and universities through guest speakers and campus tours.

AVID Elective students are motivated to do well and are serious about their academic future. Please complete the application, family information, and short answers on the following pages to help us better know your child and family circumstances.



It's that time of year when we start talking about and selecting classes for next year. On Wednesday, January 18<sup>th</sup> all 8<sup>th</sup> grade students will meet with the High School Counselors in the Auditorium during their Falcon time. The High School Counselors will talk about high school and 9<sup>th</sup> grade registration. At this time, the 8<sup>th</sup> graders will receive their registration booklets. On Thursday, January 26<sup>th</sup> the High School Counselors will return to South Middle School to register the 8<sup>th</sup> grade students for their 9<sup>th</sup> grade courses. In addition, Memorial has an informational night for all incoming 9<sup>th</sup> graders on Monday, January 23<sup>rd</sup> from 6:00PM – 7:30PM.

6<sup>th</sup> graders will be provided with course selection information for next year on January 25<sup>th</sup> while 7<sup>th</sup> graders will get this information on January 26th.
